**College/University Entrance Requirements (CADRs):**

- College/University-bound students are strongly recommended to take English 12 or higher.
- Most four-year colleges require a minimum of three full years of college-prep math through Algebra II or higher.
- Washington State four-year public universities require that students take math and/or math-based science in their 12<sup>th</sup> grade year.
- Most four-year colleges require at least two years of the same world language.
- Most four-year colleges require at least 2 years\* of lab science. Washington State public four-year universities require that one year be Algebra-based Biology, Chemistry or Physics. Western Washington University requires one year of Chemistry or Physics.
- It is the student's/parent's responsibility to contact the individual colleges for specific freshmen entrance requirements whether public, private, or out-of-state colleges or universities.
